

### **HONORS AT GRADUATION For Undergraduate Students Only**

Graduation with honors requires completion of at least 90 credits in residence at Seattle University. The minimum of 90 credits must be earned in regularly graded courses (courses in which the grades of A, B, C, D, or F are given). Should a student elect the pass/fail (P/F) option for any one course or take a course mandatorily graded CR/F as part of the 90 credit minimum, eligibility for honors at graduation will be lost.

In programs where CR/F grades are mandatory for required courses, such courses may be allowed as part of the minimum 90 credits. However, no student will be considered for honors at graduation with fewer than 80 graded credits at Seattle University.

Honors at graduation are awarded with a minimum of 90 Seattle University graded credits and a cumulative GPA as follows:

Cum Laude	3.50 to 3.69
Magna Cum Laude	3.70 to 3.89
Summa Cum Laude	3.90 to 4.00

Because the Commencement program is printed prior to spring quarter grading, honors printed in that program are calculated as of the winter quarter's grades. Diplomas and transcripts will reflect appropriate honors following spring quarter grading.

From August 1988 until February 1993 honors were awarded according to the following scale:

Cum Laude	3.50 with at least 90 SU graded credits
Magna Cum Laude	3.70 with at least 115 SU graded credits
Summa Cum Laude	3.90 with at least 135 SU graded credits

Students graduating between September 1975 and August 1988 were awarded honors on the following scale:

Cum Laude	3.40 with at least 90 SU graded credit
Magna Cum Laude	3.65 with at least 90 SU graded credit
Summa Cum Laude	3.90 with at least 90 SU graded credit

Students commencing with deficiencies should refer to Policy #83-1.
