PHILOSOPHY CORE - UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE CANDIDATES

The university Core curriculum contains two lower division philosophy courses and one upper division ethics course:

PHIL 110 Introduction to Philosophy and Critical Thinking

PHIL 210/220 Philosophy of the Human Person

PHIL, BETH or THRS 3xx Upper division ethics course approved by the core

committee to satisfy the ethics requirement

Transfers with a course equivalent to PHIL 110:

Any student who has a transferable course placed as equivalent to PHIL 110 will take PHIL 210 at Seattle University.

Transfers with 45-89 credits and no PHIL 110 equivalent:

Students with 45 to 89 transferable credits who have completed four courses of four or more credits each in at least three acceptable humanities disciplines may be granted a waiver in PHIL 110 and will take PHIL 210 at Seattle University. Students who are not waived from PHIL 110 are required to take PHIL 110 and 220 at Seattle University.

Transfers with 90 credits or more and no PHIL 110 equivalent:

Students who transfer with 90 or more credits are waived from PHIL 110 and will take PHIL 210 at Seattle University.

Post-baccalaureate students:

A student seeking a second bachelor's degree must meet the requirements of Policy #76-2, entitled "Second Baccalaureate Degree and Double Major."

All Undergraduate students:

Either PHIL 210 or 220 is considered an "essential Core" requirement for all undergraduate students seeking a first bachelor's degree. PHIL 220 is only for students who have completed PHIL 110 at Seattle University. PHIL 210 is a modification of PHIL 220 for transfer students who have satisfied PHIL 110 by a transfer course, or who are waived from PHIL 110.

An approved upper division ethics course is "essential Core" in Phase Three for all students and is to be completed at Seattle University.
