General Landscape Improvements

Streetscape

- Create coordinated internal campus streetscape system. Focus on a series of 'slipping planes' on the central spine of the Upper Mall, which can extend through the Student Center across James and south to Jefferson.
- Re-name and sign city streets within main campus using significant personages from SU history or elements of the Mission.
- Improve entries and gateways to campus with signage and landscaping.
- Preserve cobblestone and granite curb remnants on campus wherever possible, and incorporate into redeveloped walkways replacing streets.
- Improve bus shelters on campus periphery. Potential for student art or campus identification or history on shelters.
- Create clearer, more permanent Nighthawk shuttle bus shelter, perhaps associated with Marion Street entry.
- Install curb bulb pedestrian crossings wherever possible at intersections surrounding campus.
- Coordinate traffic signal timing on streets adjacent to campus to prioritize pedestrian crossings.

- Create coordinated streetscape improvement along East Cherry Street from main campus to renovated Connolly Sports Complex. Incorporate improvements into budget/plan for new housing on Cherry and 12th Avenue, as well as Phase 2 housing on 13th.
- Create streetscape improvements on alternate route to Connolly Sports Complex from Columbia Street, via 13th Avenue.

Service

- Prohibit private service vehicles from the main campus, using a central drop-off facility, transferring to smaller, electric vehicles to navigate pedestrianoriented campus walks.
- Minimize location of service and delivery areas on building edges facing public streets, especially Madison, Broadway and 12th Avenue.
- Add walls or landscape to mask other service areas. Example is the Student Center on East James Street.

Signage and Lighting

- Provide signage and banners that highlight university traditions, programs and personalities and connect to the community.
- Consider more building signage on public frontages to identify building uses and programs.
- Consider SU signage on the James Street skybridge.
- Provide athletic field lighting that minimizes impacts on surrounding neighborhood.

- Install clear directional wayfinding to campus from Interstate 5 and downtown.
- Describe preferred route for prospective staff and students to approach campus in promotional materials. Suggest Madison Street from Interstate 5, to Broadway or 12th Avenue instead of East James Street.
- Install a signage/banner system at perimeter of campus to identify edges.

Landscape

- Reduce thick shrubbery on campus edges to improve visibility and visual access into campus.
- Create thematic gardens with public interest and public art such as the Ethnobotanic Garden in highly-visible, unbuildable areas.
