

POST-BACCALAUREATE APPLICANTS (formerly "Fifth-Year")

I. Definition of Post-Baccalaureate Level

A post-baccalaureate student is one who has completed a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution and who has been admitted to Seattle University for additional undergraduate study which is intended to culminate in a second bachelor's degree, a certificate or the fulfillment of prerequisites for a particular Seattle University degree program. Second baccalaureate degree applicants refer to Policy #76-2 for requirements.

II. Documents Required for Post-Baccalaureate Status Application

A. A completed application. (Note: An international student wishing to pursue a certificate and requiring an I-20 form from Seattle University should complete the special international student application.)

B. Current application fee.

C. Official transcripts from all prior and current post-secondary institutions, including verification of an acceptable bachelor's degree.

D. An international student or one whose first language is not English must submit a minimum computer-based TOEFL score of 190 (520). Any applicant with TOEFL score between 190 and 237 (520 and 579) must successfully complete the Culture and Language Bridge Program during the first term of attendance.

III. Grade Point Average Requirements

An applicant must have achieved a minimum evaluated grade point average of 2.50 to be eligible for admission. The calculation is based upon the last 90 quarter credits of the baccalaureate degree plus any post-baccalaureate coursework from a regionally accredited college or professional school.

IV. The matriculated student will be assessed a one-time matriculation fee in the first quarter of attendance at Seattle University.
